### **The Position:**

The Interventional Cardiologist will be responsible for ensuring high-quality, cost-effective care of cardiac patients and their families. The successful candidate will demonstrate both clinical and technical skills in interventional cardiology. It is expected that the individual will have gained experience in diagnosing, selecting therapies, performing diagnostic and interventional procedures, and judging the effectiveness of

treatments for patients with chronic ischemic heart disease, acute ischemic syndromes, and valvular heart disease.

In addition to performing interventions, the cardiologist will see office patients, will be in the hospital (Shands–AGH) a couple of days per week, and will also be involved in catheterizations in the office.

### **Educational Requirements:**

The selected candidate will be a graduate of an accredited Medical School along with successful completion of an Internal Medicine residency program and completion of an approved fellowship program in Cardiology.

### **The Community:**

Cardiology Associates of Gainesville is located in Gainesville, Florida. Gainesville is located halfway between Atlanta and Miami and is within a two hour drive from cities such as Jacksonville, Ocala, Orlando, Tallahassee, Tampa, and St. Augustine. The community is also located within a short drive of the Gulf of Mexico and the Atlantic Ocean.

Gainesville serves as the cultural, educational and commercial center for the North Central Florida Region. Known for its preservation of historic buildings and the beauty of its natural surroundings, Gainesville's numerous parks, museums and lakes provide entertainment to thousands of visitors. Because of its beautiful landscape and urban "forest", Gainesville is one of the most attractive cities in Florida. *Sperling's Best* even named Gainesville one of the "Top Ten Cities in the USA for Outdoor Activities".

Gainesville is also home to some of the finest education programs in the Nation. Including, Gainesville's Eastside High School, which has been ranked within the Top Six high schools for the past two years by *Newsweek* as being one of the best high schools that prepares students for college. Florida's largest and oldest university, The University of Florida is also located within the Gainesville community. In 2006, 19 Gainesville Area Schools received most improved FCAT writing scores.

In the 1980's its surrounding neighborhoods created historic districts and this preserved their unique residential character and protected their fine Victorian homes. These preservation efforts spurred the City's willingness to sponsor and financially support significant restoration to projects like the Historic Thomas Center (a cultural center for visitors), the five-story Union Street Station, the courthouse, and library were built, while older buildings like the Star

Garage, the Florida Theatre, and the Bethel Gas Station were restored. As a fitting highlight to these revitalization efforts *Money Magazine* in 1995 named Gainesville as the most livable city in America.
